

FALL HIGHLIGHT: THE SCHIRN KUNSTHALLE FRANKFURT SHEDS LIGHT ON MARC CHAGALL'S WORK FROM THE 1930S AND 1940S IN A LARGE-SCALE EXHIBITION

CHAGALL WORLD IN TURMOIL NOVEMBER 4, 2022 – FEBRUARY 19, 2023

Marc Chagall (1887–1985) is regarded as a poet among the artists of modernism. As a highlight this fall, the Schirn Kunsthalle Frankfurt is dedicating an extensive exhibition to the artist, now for the first time in Germany in fifteen years. From November 4, 2022, to February 19, 2023, *Chagall: World in Turmoil* sheds light on a facet of his oeuvre that is less well known: Chagall's works from the 1930s and 1940s, in which his colorful palette becomes darker.

As a Jew ish painter, Chagall w as again and again exposed to existential threats, which had formative effects on his life and work. In the early 1930s, he addressed the increasingly aggressive anti-Semitism and finally emigrated to the United States in 1941 due to persecution by the National Socialists. His artistic work created during these years touches on central topics such as identity, home, and exile. Show ing roughly 100 haunting paintings, works on paper, and costumes, the exhibition traces the artist's s earch for a visual vocabulary in view of displacement and persecution. It presents important works from the 1930s, in which Chagall increasingly occupied himself with the Jew ish lifeworld, numerous self-portraits, his turn to allegorical and biblical topics, the important designs for the ballets *Aleko* (1942) and *The Firebird* (1945) while in exile, the recurring examination of his home city of Vitebsk, and major works like *The Falling Angel* (1923/1933/1947). In the show, the Schirn facilitates a new and highly topical perspective on the oeuvre of one of the most important artists of the twentieth century.

For the presentation, the Schirn has obtained important loans from numerous German and international museums, and from public and private collections—including Kunsthaus Zürich, Museo de Arte Thyssen-Bornemisza, Madrid, Centre Pompidou, Paris, Musée National d'Art Moderne, Paris, Tel Aviv Museum of Art, Stedelijk Museum, Amsterdam, Moderna Museet, Stockholm, The Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, Smart Museum of Art, Chicago, Tate Modern, London, and Musée national Marc Chagall, Nice—and is bringing these works together in Frankfurt.
